







Should the Florida Democratic Party Open Their Primaries?

A Poll of Independents and Democrats

BACKGROUND: Nikki Fried, the chair of the Florida Democratic Party has said that the party is considering opening their primaries to the 3.4 million independent voters (no party affiliation) across the state.

METHODOLOGY: This poll was conducted from August 5 – September 1, 2025. The poll was conducted online and via email. The poll included 684 independent (NPA) voters and 626 Democrats from across the state.





Would you support a lobbying effort directed at the DP to ask them to do the following: **1.** Open their primaries to NPA voters and call on the RP to do the same **2.** Acknowledge they made a mistake in 2020 in opposing open primaries when it was on the ballot **3.** Introduce legislation for a nonpartisan primary system for the state **4.** Pledge to stop using the "write in loophole" that allows them to close primaries when only one party has a primary.
